TOTAL PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

Total Program Management is a comprehensive solution where Little Scholars assumes management of your summer camp program, eliminating the need for an in-house coordinator to oversee your summer camp program.

Little Scholars will:

- Provide an On-Site Coordinator who will oversee the program daily
- Work with reputable vendors to create a schedule of camps to be offered
- Create a registration page and provide your school a link for parents
- Manage student registration
- Create rosters for each camp
- Manage daily attendance
- Communicate with parents
- Manage vendor payments

Little Scholars' On-Site Coordinator will:

- Serve as the on-site presence once occupied by a staff member
- Print copies of rosters for every camp and provide copies to each teacher
- Assure a timely start to the program
- Check in with teachers to ensure needs are met
- Report any daily issues or concerns back to Little Scholars so that quick solutions can be enacted
- Supervise an orderly and safe dismissal
- Ensure classrooms are returned to their original condition

Role of your school:

- Market programs to students and their families:
 - Send out email blasts promoting the programs and providing a link to register
 - Send home flyers or stickers with students as a reminder to register
 - > Advertise programs via the school's social media accounts
- Provide Little Scholars space at your school to run a successful program
- Provide Little Scholars with a list of rules and procedures you wish followed



COVID-19 PROCEDURES

Little Scholars is committed to providing a safe environment for your students. We will continue to adhere to your school's policies and procedures. In accordance with the CDC guidelines for schools, we have adopted the following procedures:

PROMOTE HEALTHY HYGIENE PRACTICES

- Review, teach and reinforce washing hands and covering coughs and sneezes among children and staff.
- Require teachers to cover their face with a cloth face. <u>If your school requires a different</u> <u>type of face mask, this must be provided by the school. If your school requires additional</u> <u>hygiene measures such as gloves or booties, these must be provided by the school.</u>
- Remind teachers not to touch the face covering and instruct them on the proper use, removal, and washing of cloth face coverings.
- Post a sign inside the classroom and on the classroom door on how to stop the spread of COVID-19, properly wash hands, promote everyday protective measures, and properly wear a face covering. If your school requires specific signage, this must be provided by the school.

School Provides:

- A classroom with a sink or that is within proximity to a sink.
- Hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol, anti-bacterial soap, paper towels and tissues to support healthy hygiene behaviors.

INTENSIFY CLEANING, DISINFECTION, AND VENTILATION

Parents will be required to send full water bottles labeled with their child's name daily.

- Clean, sanitize, and disinfect shared objects between use. <u>If your school requires a specific</u> cleaning product, this must be provided by the school.
- Avoid use of items (for example, soft or plush toys) that are not easily cleaned, sanitized, or disinfected.
- Keep disinfectants away from children.
- We will not open windows and doors if doing so poses a safety or health risk (for example, allowing pollens in or exacerbating asthma symptoms) to children using the facility.
- Not use shared surfaces such as water fountains. <u>Parents will be required to send full water</u> <u>bottles with their children daily.</u>

ENSURE SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Maintain student and staff groupings as static as possible by having the same group of children stay with the same staff throughout the camp week.
- Restrict activity in higher transmission areas such as playgrounds and dining halls. <u>If</u> <u>outside time is permitted by the school, it is up to the school to stagger the outside times so</u> <u>that proper social distancing with other camps can be enforced.</u>

- Ensure space seating/desks to at least six feet apart.
- Serve meals in classrooms in child's designated area ensuring children are not sharing food or utensils.
- Arrival and drop-off at classroom door with limit direct contact with parents as much as possible.

LIMIT SHARING

- Keep each child's belongings separated from others' and in individually labeled areas.
- Food will be replaced with alternative items except for cooking based classes.
- Avoid sharing toys, books, and other games or learning aids.

TRAIN ALL STAFF

• We will train all teachers and staff in the above safety actions.

CHECK FOR SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Encourage teachers to stay home if they are sick.
- Encourage parents to keep sick children home.
- Parents will take their child's temperature before camp each day as a part of an 'honor system.' <u>If your school requires a specific temperature checks, we will follow school policies on checking students' temperatures before entering the building. If the teacher will be taking temperatures, the school will provide thermometers and recording method.</u>

PLAN IF A TEACHER OR CHILD BECOMES SICK

- Follow the school's policy on an isolation room or area to separate a child who exhibits COVID-like symptoms.
- Immediately send teacher home.
- Alert the school contact when a teacher or child is identified as sick.
- Teacher will assist in closing off areas used by a sick child.
- Will not use classroom again until it has been cleaned and disinfected by school's cleaning crew.
- Advise sick teacher not to return until they have met CDC criteria to discontinue home isolation.
- Work with the school to inform those exposed to a person with COVID-19 to stay home and self-monitor for symptoms and follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.

MAINTAIN HEALTHY OPERATIONS

- Designate a staff person to be responsible for responding to COVID-19 concerns.
- Schools will be notified of who this person is and how to contact them.
- Create a communication system for staff and families for self-reporting of symptoms and notification of exposures and closures.
- Parents will be required to sign an Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/COVID-19 before their child attends a Little Scholars' camp.
