Eligibility & Information

- Camp cost is \$260 per student per week
- W&L Employees are asked to register with their university email address.
- Families may use HSA or Dependent Care FSA to pay for summer programs.

 - Rising Kindergarten (child must be eligible to attend Kindergarten in Fall 2025)- Rising 6th grade.

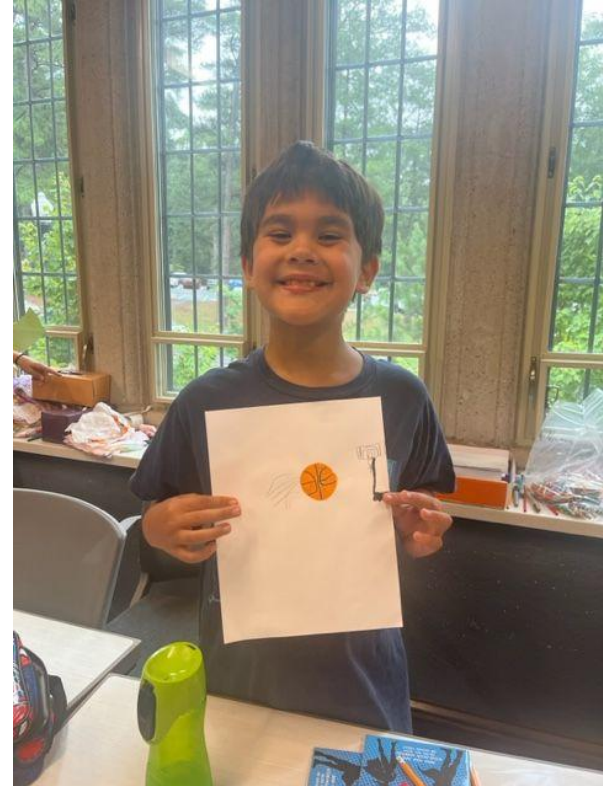

General Questions

What if I need to cancel my registration?

Please communicate any cancellations directly with Little Scholars as soon as possible. Some cancellation fees may apply. Please see below for information about fees.

What does my child need to bring to camp?

Each child should bring two snacks, a labeled water bottle, and lunch. Packed lunches must be non-perishable, as there is no access to a refrigerator.

Can I bring my campers to camp late or leave early, or take them to lunch as my schedule dictates?

Yes, please notify Little Scholars directly and in advance to ensure a smooth check-in/out process daily in consideration of staff and other campers. You will need to sign your child out with a valid ID.



How are the children split into camps?

Camps will be split by grades, depending on enrollment.

What will be required at pick up?

ID (W&L ID or driver's license) will be required to pick up your child. If someone other than the parent or guardians listed on the permissions during registration will be picking up your child, we must have this in writing, and they will be required to show an ID at pick up.

Can my child bring electronic devices to camp?

We discourage students from bringing electronics to camp. If they do bring a device to camp, the teacher or OSC will hold onto the device during camp. LS is not responsible for any lost or damaged devices that are brought to camp.
